## SARAH'S STORY

Sarah (not her real name) was overwhelmed as she reached out to Love INC in November. Her husband had died suddenly. The bills were coming in and she needed financial assistance to get her through the next couple of months. Her husband provided their only income. She had contacted social security, food share and energy assistance, but these things take time.

Sarah was attending a church who was there for her the day her husband passed away. Love INC reached out to two partner churches. They were able to provide financial assistance for rent, utilities, and a furnace repair bill. They also delivered food for a Christmas meal.

Today Sarah is attending a Grief Share Support Group weekly at one of our partner churches. And, a partner church continues to reach out to Sarah through phone calls and texts a couple times per week.

This has been a deep valley for Sarah to travel. However, with the help of Love INC and our partner churches, she did not have to go through this journey alone. The church will continue to provide spiritual support and prayer to Sarah in the weeks and months ahead.

### POVERTY SIMULATION

The Poverty Simulation is an interactive, professional development tool that provides a window into the lives of low-income families and the struggles they face to overcome barriers of joblessness, homelessness, crime, illiteracy and lack of quality childcare. Participants are assigned a role within a family and provided with background information regarding their income and expenses. Family units are then asked to achieve goals over the "4-week" simulation, such as pay bills, feed children, get them to school, go to work or get a job, access community resources, etc. Participants gain a better understanding of the challenges associated with living in poverty and emerge with a greater sensitivity to the plight and needs of low-income families and individuals. This simulation is open to all and we are seeking both volunteers to serve as vendors/service providers, and participants to be given a family scenario. **Registration is required by calling Wendy at the Extension Wood County office at 715-421-8437 by March 29th.**
