**LOVE STORY**



After being hospitalized for six months in the spring of 2018, Sam was severely disabled. He was referred to Love INC by United Way 2-1-1. He needed help with snow removal. He did not have any friends or family in the area. As our Intake Specialist (Jean) listened to Sam tell his story, she learned Sam also wanted to improve his relationship with his daughters. They ended their conversation with prayer and Jean let him know we would add him to our prayer list.

A Love INC volunteer (Bob) went to Sam's home to shovel after the next snowfall. A neighbor stopped by and said he just got a new snowblower and he would snow blow the driveway. That evening Sam left a voice message for Jean: "You sent Bob over to shovel for me. Thank you very much. I really appreciate it. It helped me out very, very much."

When we followed up with Sam a couple weeks later, Sam said the neighbor is continuing to remove the snow and he no longer needs assistance with snow removal. He was also excited to share that his daughter had come to visit him over Christmas.

Not only did the Lord provide for snow removal, Sam's relationship with his daughter is improving and he has a new relationship with his neighbor.

Saint Lawrence, one of our partner churches, is hosting a special event on Tuesday, April 9<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm. A screening and discussion of the documentary “Screenagers” will be at the Fine Arts Center at McMillan Memorial Library in Wisconsin Rapids.

*“Are you watching kids scroll through life, with their rapid-fire thumbs and a six-second attention span? Physician and filmmaker Delaney Ruston saw that with her own kids and learned that the average kid spends 6.5 hours a day looking at screens. She wondered about the impact of all this time and about the friction occurring in homes and schools around negotiating screen time—friction she knew all too well. In SCREENAGERS Delaney takes a deeply personal approach as she probes into the vulnerable corners of family life, including her own, to explore struggles over social media, video games, academics and internet addiction. Through poignant, and unexpectedly funny stories, along with surprising insights from authors, psychologists, and brain scientists, SCREENAGERS reveals how tech time impacts kids’ development and offers solutions on how adults can empower kids to best navigate the digital world and find balance.”*
