Frank initially made contact with the Connection Center in December of 2019. He called in search of housing, however, as it often happens through the intake process, it was realized that his needs were much greater. Frank is a veteran who suffers from several medical issues which limit his mobility. He was working with VA Home Based services and INCLUSA, but there were still gaps in meeting all his needs. Through our intake, we were able to assess and help address those additional needs. Through our Partner Churches, we were able to connect Frank with an Ally Minister who could walk beside Frank providing the emotional and spiritual support he so desperately needed. Frank also needed help moving to a temporary living situation in a local hotel while he was waiting for his permanent housing. Another Partner Church that provides assistance in packing and moving was able to address that need for Frank. Lastly, we learned that

being in the hotel made it quite difficult for Frank to provide himself with healthy meals. Again, a Partner Church's Frozen Meal Ministry was able to provide some healthy meals during this temporary time. As we do with all our clients, we continue to talk and pray for Frank regularly.

We Continue to Serve, Just Differently



So much has changed recently and we too are learning to adapt and manage things a bit differently due to the COVID-19 Safer at Home order. The Connection Center remains open and is receiving calls from individuals in need in the

South Wood County area. However, for the safety of our staff and volunteers, our Intake Specialists are responding to those calls from their own homes. Also, staff and committee meetings, our Ambassadors Breakfasts, and discussions with our church and agency partners are all taking place by video conferencing or telephone. We continue, however, through our partnership with local Christian churches, volunteers, and community organizations, to offer assistance to our neighbors as best and as safely as we possibly can.

Church Partner Spotlight Immanuel Lutheran

Love INC is blessed with 16 wonderful Church Partners. Each month in our newsletter, we would like to spotlight one of them and a highlight a ministry that they provide to our community that answers God's call to "Love Thy Neighbor."

Immanuel Lutheran has been a Love INC church partner since 2017. This month's SPOTLIGHT features a service they provide to the community called

Ruby's Pantry. The mission of Ruby's Pantry is to activate people in being alert to the needs of others and to be proactive in encouraging faith, showing friendship and meeting tangible needs of neighbors, friends and strangers regardless of race, religion or ethnicity.

Ruby's Pantry is for ANYONE that eats! There is no income or residency requirement and Ruby's Pantry is for anyone looking to extend their monthly grocery budget. Each guest donates a \$20 donation and receives an abundance of grocery items. Ruby's Pantry is not government funded and is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization. Each donation is used to cover operational costs like trucking, gas, and warehouse staff. All of the food is donated by corporate food donors making it possible to reach more families each month at locations across Minnesota and Wisconsin.

Immanuel Lutheran started participating in Ruby's Pantry about five years ago and it is currently coordinated by Brian Betts, Immanuel Lutheran School Principal. We are so thankful for Immanuel Lutheran and Ruby's Pantry as many clients who call Love INC are then referred to Ruby's Pantry if they are in need of this type of service. We are so thankful to the volunteers who are dedicated in bringing this service to our community. You are truly the helping hands of Christ.
