## **Background:**

The landmark Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) study conducted in the 1990s with the CDC and Kaiser Permanente taught the healthcare community the important relationship between trauma and health. ACEs and trauma are common: More than two-thirds of respondents in the original study reported experience of an ACE; other studies have that number as high as 80 percent. Understanding ACEs and the impact on individuals, has a dramatic effect on how we respond to those we serve.
